### **Profile of the Keynote Speaker**

Dr. Wee Chan Au is a Senior Lecturer at the School of Business, Monash University Malaysia. Her research interest lies in work, health and wellbeing, especially the challenges in attaining work-life balance in today's fast-paced economy and rapid technological advancement. Focusing on Malaysia, she explores the manner and extent to which organisational and HR practices impact work and wellbeing. Fundamentally, she is interested in people and the development of human capital – what motivates employees and entrepreneurs, how do they respond to personal or structural constraints, setbacks and challenges, to what extent do cultural background influence their choice and course of action?

She has published her work in edited books and leading scholarly journals, such as Journal of Business Ethics, Journal of Social Entrepreneurship and Personnel Review. She also advocates staying well while working hard, which has motivated her to co-develop a Wellbeing Toolkit for social entrepreneurs.

She has received funding from the British Council and Academy of Science Malaysia (2018), and most recently, the Ministry of Higher education (2019) to investigate work, health and wellbeing issues in Malaysia. She has also been actively involved in regional, national and industry-related projects commissioned by Economic Planning Unit (under the Prime Minister's Office) Malaysia (2014-2016), Malaysian Plastics and Machinery Association (MPMA) (2016), Certified Practising Accountants (CPA) Australia (2016-2020), and The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) (2018).

Dr. Au holds a PhD in Human Resource Management from Monash University (2011). Prior to her academic career, she worked as a project executive in a government agency under the Ministry of Primary Industries (formerly known as the Ministry of Plantation Industries and Commodities), Malaysia.
